

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- The insert is made of polylactide polymers - PLA (in the deluxe version with 30% wood fibres).
- PLA is formed from natural sugars and starches and is therefore fully biodegradable.
- Do not expose printed products to direct UV light and temperature above 50°C – deformation (bending, twisting) could occur.
- The products are intended for storage in a closed box, not for mechanical stress.
- Store the insert in a dry environment.
- The material is fragile, please do not test its elasticity.
- Not intended for use with food.
- Insert may contain small parts – not intended for children under 14 years of age.



MAINTENANCE

- Empty insert can be wiped with a water dampened cloth without added chemicals or detergents.

- The included **QR code sticker** is intended to be placed on the inside of the board game box lid. It provides quick and convenient access to illustrated instructions for placing the organizer into the game box.
